

EXAMPLES OF PROJECTS FUNDED BY CPA GRANTS IN TOWNS ACROSS WESTERN MASSACHUSETTS

Conway	<u>Pickleball Courts (behind Conway Grammar School)</u>	150,000 to the Town of Conway Parks and Recreation Committee for the construction of four pickleball courts behind the Conway Grammar School for community use.
Hampden	<u>North Road Access to Mt. Vision</u>	Purchase of parcel to allow access to Mt Vision conservation land and trails.
Hampden	<u>Mt Vision Trailhead Improvement</u>	Design and construction of a trailhead access and parking area for the Mt Vision conservation property.
Hampden	<u>Memorial Park Shade Structures</u>	Purchase and installation of 2 shade structures within the boundary of the spray park.
Hatfield	<u>Tree canopy restoration</u>	Continuing Project Phase 2 to Install Shade Trees and Maintain Tree Canopy in Historic Districts
Hatfield	<u>Create and Develop Pickleball and Tennis Courts</u>	To Create and Develop Pickleball and Tennis Courts on Town Owned Land.
Hatfield	<u>Day Pond Renovation and Reclamation</u>	To Survey, water quality testing, baseline assessment, core collection, lab testing, and reporting on the feasibility of Renovation and Reclamation of Town Owned Day Pond
Hatfield	<u>Restore and Preserve Vital Town Records Phase #2</u>	To Restore and Preserve Vital Town Records maintained by the Town Clerk
Hatfield	<u>Smith Academy Park Pavilion Construction</u>	Additional Funding for Pavilion Construction
Hatfield	<u>Historic Walking Tour</u>	Project is to create a Historic Walking Tour of significant historic homes, locations, and events along Main Street, Maple Street, Elm Street, Prospect Street, and School Street, including the purchase of bronze plaques with descriptions of historical events, important people, and significant locations as they relate to Hatfield's history.

Hatfield	Preservation of Headstones in Hill Cemetery	Project to preserve, restore, or replace historic headstones in Hill Cemetery
Hatfield	Preservation and Restoration of Historic Town Owned Clock	Project to preserve and restore the facade, belfry, and clock enclosures of the town-owned clock in the steeple of First Congregational Church.
Hatfield	Restoration and Rehabilitation of Town Owned Day Pond	Project to restore and rehabilitate Town Owned Day Pond at Smith Academy for recreation, education, and open space purposes.
Hatfield	Preservation and Restoration of Cutter Farm Museum	Project to document, assess condition, clean, move, restore, and prepare summary of Cutter Farm Museum contents, including digital using into state of art searchable database the contents of Farm Museum. In addition, to create a long term conservation plan for Farm Museum items, to identify needed repairs, structural upgrades, weatherization and conservation including identifying grants to protect building and contents in future.

Hatfield	Cutter Farm Museum Rehabilitation	Restore and rehabilitate the siding and roofing of the Cutter Farm Museum
Hatfield	Main Street Cemetery Walkways & Fencing	Restore and rehabilitate the walkways, fencing, and other historical features.
Hatfield	Dredging of Day Pond	Dredging of Day Pond, pursuant to the Day Pond restoration
Hatfield	Main Street Cemetery Rehabilitation	Main Street Cemetery roadway expansion and rehabilitation
Hatfield	Oliver Smith Park	Installation of the Oliver Smith Park
Hatfield	Bradstreet Cemetery Rehabilitation	To restore and rehabilitate the main roadways on the east and west sides of the Bradstreet Cemetery

Leverett	Heritage Park and Nature Trail Along the Sawmill River- Part I	Development of a Heritage Park and Nature Trail on 2.6 acres of land owned by the Friends of the North Leverett Sawmill, adjacent to the Slarrow Sawmill. Installation of interpretative signs describing sawmill history, park and trail layout, Native American pre- and post-colonial land use. Installation of benches along trails, native plant pollinator garden, pavilion on site of former sugar shack.
Leverett	Heritage Park and Nature Trail Along the Sawmill River- Part I	Part 2 of this project extends the work done in Part 1 onto the Town owned land. It specifically involves accessing the historic site of the Graves ironworks, and includes interpretive signs, installation of a plank foot bridge and rubbish clearing and installation of a rock filled Gabion basket across a drainage ditch.
Leverett	Heronemus Forest Conservation Project	Acquisition of 91 acres of open space and recreation land. Kestrel Trust to maintain and improve the existing trail system and create a small parking area for public access.
Leverett	Leverett/North Leverett Sawmill	create an operational, fundraising, building assessment and design plan for the creation of a participatory technological and industrial history museum in the Slarrow Mill,
Leverett	Transfer of Set-Aside Balance to Affordable Housing Trust	Transfer of accumulated minimum balance for Affordable Housing to Leverett Affordable Housing Trust. (\$114,900)
Leverett	Library Pocket Park	Construction of a fully accessible "Pocket Park" on library grounds, including walking trail and covered stage.
Leverett	Weights and Measures	Restoration of cabinet housing historic weights and measures, and moving to display area at Town Hall
Leverett	Rattlesnake Gutter Trail	Restore and improve section of Rattlesnake Gutter Road that is within town-owned Rattlesnake Gutter Conservation Area.
Leverett	Graves Iron Works Mapping	Archaeological mapping of historic site, remains and artifacts to facilitate further work on the site.

Northfield	Field Library Sign Restoration	Provides funding to replace the Field Library sign on the front of the building. The current sign is deteriorating and rotting to the point of being removed as a safety hazard. The Field Library is considered an important historic and community resource.
Northfield	Repair of Historic Outside Fireplace	Provides funding to repair the crumbling stonework of the outside fireplace located behind Squakheag Village at 88 Main Street. This fireplace was part of Northfield's American Youth Hostel which was the first official American Youth Hostel location in the United States established in 1934.
Northfield	Historic Outside Fireplace Repair	Provides funding to repair the crumbling stonework of the outside fireplace located behind Squakheag Village at 88 Main Street. This fireplace was part of Northfield's American Youth Hostel which was the first official American Youth Hostel location in the United States established in 1934.
Northfield	Senior Center Shed & Grill	Provides funding for the Northfield Senior Center to purchase a propane grill and a recreational storage shed to be placed behind the town hall. The shed and grill will allow the Senior Center to provide more opportunities for outdoor gatherings, events, and recreational activities.
Northfield	Library Reading Room Wall Restoration	Provides funding for the professional conservation and repair of the library's upstairs reading room's original ombre milk paint and stencil work. The Historical Commission recognizes the historical and cultural importance of this building and supports this project. Misha Storm is the library director and will arrange for the work to be done and will make sure that the work done will meet the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation which pertain to historic buildings.

Northfield	NES Playground Pavilion	Provides funding for the Northfield Elementary School (NES) PTO to build a pavilion on the NES playground. Placement of the pavilion is subject to the approval of the Pioneer Valley Regional School authorities. The pavilion will add a shaded gathering area for educational and recreational activities, public events, and outdoor gatherings. The Recreational Commission supports this project. The NES PTO will oversee the building and installation of the pavilion.
Northfield	Historical Society Shelving & Digitization of Documents	Provides funding to purchase shelving to improve the storage of historical documents at the Northfield History Museum and to purchase digitization equipment to enable scanning of historical documents to the Town database. The Historical Commission supports this project.
Northfield	Dickenson Hall 1890 Restoration	Provides funding to repair and replace the deteriorating siding, trim and windowsills of the exterior of the building and to replace the deteriorated and non-repairable plaster from the first floor stairwell. Northfield Dickenson Hall (545 Mt. Hermon Station Rd) was built in 1890 and was one of the first and remaining school buildings in Northfield. The Historical Commission recognizes the historical and cultural importance of this building and supports this project. The Northfield VFW is the caretaker of this building and will arrange for the work to be done and will make sure that the work done will meet the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation which pertain to historic buildings.
Northfield	Hobo Falls Conservation Area Acquisition	Provides funding for Northfield Open Space Committee to cover the legal costs associated with transferring privately owned parcels of land to the town of Northfield. Hobo Falls Conservation Area features a hiking trail to a dramatic waterfall that crashes down steep cliffs. The owner of this parcel would like to donate this 8-acre parcel and two adjoining parcels to the town to preserve for conservation and recreation. Mount Grace staff will be managing the work for the conservation restrictions.

Northfield	Center Cemetery Grave Stone Restoration	Provides funding to purchase cleaning and repairing supplies as part of the Northfield Historical Commission's Center Cemetery restoration project. This cemetery was established in 1686 and is Northfield's first burying ground. Currently the cemetery is in disrepair, most stones are overgrown with moss and dirt making them unreadable and many stones have shifted over time and are leaning or completely fallen over. Members of the Historical Commission have received training in how best to clean, rest and repair stones.
Northfield	Northfield History Museum Heat Pumps	Provides funding for adding heat pumps as climate control for the two main collection rooms for the Northfield Historical Society at the Northfield History Museum - located at 13 Pine St, Northfield. High temperatures and levels of humidity are hugely detrimental to archival collections, especially paper and photographic materials. The addition of the heat pumps will help to save the town's historic materials from deteriorating.

Shutesbury	Top of the Lake Invasive Plants	Removal of invasive plants from Top of the Lake Conservation Area
Shutesbury	Phase Two Guide Board Rehab	Complete Work of Restoring and Rehabbing Town Common Guide Board
Shutesbury	Preserve South Brook Recreation Trails	Restore and Repair Lake Wyola South Brook Conservation Area Trails
Shutesbury	West Cemetery Preservation Phase II	Additional Restoration and Preservation of Grave stones in West Cemetery
Whately	Reconstruction of Tennis Courts at Frontier High school	Renovation of the existing tennis courts at Frontier Regional High School, including but not limited to the installation of a new surface, fences and nets.
Whately	Restoration of the front porch at S. White Dickinson Memorial Library	Preservation of the steps at the S. White Dickinson Memorial Library, including but not limited to repair of the steps, repair of the surrounding masonry and columns and replacement of the wrought iron railing.
Whately	Restoration of the historic ceramic-tiled silo at Quonquont Farm	Restoration of one of three masonry silos at Quonquont Farm, including but not limited to the replacement of the roof and repair/ restoration of the masonry tiles.
Whately	Herlihy Batting Cages	The construction of batting cages at Herlihy Park
Whately	Rehabilitation of Town Owned Barn	Rehabilitation of the Town owned barn with work to be done according to the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for historic preservation.
Whately	Center School Feasibility Study Match	To determine potential uses for the 1910 Whately Center School by completing a study that identifies options for the future repurposing of the building and identifying options for bringing the building into alignment for the future reuse.
Whately	Library Roof	To replace a portion of the roof at the Library at 202 Chestnut Plain Road with the work to be done according to the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Preservation
Whately	Tri-Town Beach Swimming Dock	to add a 100-foot dock to the beach swim area to improve access and safety. It will be a floating dock of the same material used in the 2023 raft.
