

### What Makes These Trails Unique?

This is a managed forest. It is a great place to learn about trees, timber harvesting, wildlife, and forest regrowth. Because much of the forest canopy has been opened up, you will hear a greater variety and number of bird songs in the Spring. As you come back to visit over the years, watch forest succession take place. Small plants will increase in number and eventually new trees will grow taller and shade out the smaller plants.

#### **Active Logging Present?**

*If active logging is underway, please proceed with caution and do not approach equipment.*

**Keep Dogs Under Control.** Many visitors come to view birds and other wildlife. It is natural for dogs to chase wildlife. Keep dogs on a leash. Scoop and bury or haul home doggy poop bags.

**Please stay on, or at least relatively close, to the "marked" trails.** Not all woods roads are part of this trail system. The public only has permission to be on Foxbard Farm property at this location. If you stray from the marked trail, you may be entering other private properties.
